The accelerated Bachelor of Social Work provides an excellent education that includes the knowledge, skills and values needed to practice as a generalist social worker, become licensed as a BSW, or attend graduate school.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Graduates of this program are prepared for work in a variety of areas within family and children's services including protective services and intensive services to families; substance abuse prevention and treatment; case management with mentally ill or developmentally disabled individuals in community mental health centers; casework in juvenile justice settings; probation case work within a legal setting; community work to develop and provide programs to help elderly remain independent; residential treatment programs for children and adolescents; and social work in nursing homes and hospitals.

GETTING STARTED

Admission into one of Spring Arbor University's degree completion programs requires prior completion of 58 semester hours. Hours can be earned through testing and approved courses taken at other accredited institutions.

- 1 | Submit completed application, \$30 application fee, autobiographical outline and writing sample. (If you apply online, we waive the fee.)
- 2 | Send your official transcripts from each college you have attended (must be official transcripts issued by the institution).
- 3 | Complete financial aid information such as the FAFSA, student loan request forms and employer assistance forms, if applicable. Our admissions specialists are available to help you if you have any questions.
