CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Upon completion of the program, students are eligible for Council on Family Life Relations accreditation. Professional opportunities allow graduates to work in a variety of settings including family service agencies, legal services, referral programs, transportation programs, nursing homes, hospitals, day care centers, public health clinics, group homes, senior centers, religious organizations and corrections.

GETTING STARTED

Admission into one of Spring Arbor University's degree completion programs requires prior completion of 58 semester hours. Hours can be earned through testing and approved courses taken at other accredited institutions.

- 1 | Submit completed application, \$30 application fee, autobiographical outline and writing sample. (If you apply online, we waive the fee.)
- 2 | Send your official transcripts from each college you have attended (must be official transcripts issued by the institution).
- 3 | Complete financial aid information such as the FAFSA, student loan request forms and employer assistance forms, if applicable. Our admissions specialists are available to help you if you have any questions.
