The Master of Arts in Counseling program helps students integrate counseling theory and practice with a Christian perspective. The core curriculum includes a 100-hour practicum and a 600-hour internship.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

The program provides comprehensive academic instruction and clinical experience for students interested in assisting others in a counseling setting. The degree offers two concentrations: community (agency) counseling and school counseling.

LICENSURES FOR MICHIGAN

Within Michigan, counselors must become a licensed professional counselor (LPC) to work in any facility as a professional counselor other than a K-12 school setting. Counseling in schools requires a school counselor license from the Michigan Department of Education.

GETTING STARTED

- 1 | Complete and submit an application and a \$40 nonrefundable application fee. (If you apply online, we waive the fee.)
- 2 | Send your official transcripts from each college you have attended (must be official transcripts issued by the institution).
- 3 | Complete financial aid information such as the FAFSA, student loan request forms and employer assistance forms, if applicable. Our admissions specialists are available to help you if you have any questions.

All applicants must complete a successful interview with the director of the MAC Program and/or designees for admission consideration.
