Spring Arbor University will accept a maximum of 68 semester hours from a community college. Following is a list of Lake Michigan College transfer courses, which may be applied to meet the intent of SAU courses. Lake Michigan College courses not listed here may also transfer, as general elective credit (or to meet course requirements in an available major or minor), if they are numbered 100-299 and the grade earned is a “C” (2.0) or higher. 100-level courses will not be considered upper division credit at SAU. 200-level courses that meet the intent of Upper Level (300-399) courses at SAU may count as Upper Level credit, on a course-by-course basis. Transferable, technical hours are limited to 20.
