

**SPRING ARBOR UNIVERSITY
CREDIT BY EXAMINATION POLICIES (CLEP)**

**Fee for 2020-2021 is \$85.00.

GENERAL POLICIES:

1. An SAU student may earn up to a limit of 60 hours through credit by exam.
2. No more than one-third of the credit hours required in a major, minor, endorsement or certificate may be earned through credit by exam.
3. Students will not be allowed to count credit from a CLEP exam if they are already enrolled in a class which meets the requirement. Credit will not be accepted for any examination which covers information included in a previous class or test completed by the student. (E.g. coursework or a test which covers ART 152, MUS 152 or ENG 112 would prevent acceptance of the Humanities CLEP exam.)
4. In disciplines where courses are sequential (i.e. math, sciences, languages), a student who has taken a higher-level course may not use a lower-level examination to earn additional credit at the lower level.
5. ENG 104 College Writing cannot be satisfied through CLEP.
6. Students should receive prior approval from the Office of Registration and Records before taking an examination to ensure the credits will be applied if the test is passed with the appropriate score.
7. A CLEP examination may be repeated three months (90 calendar days) from the date examination as administered.
8. For a listing of testing locations for CLEP examinations, go to www.collegeboard.com/clep.
9. All CLEP examinations are computerized testing. Students will be able to receive their score following the exam. Use the SAU code number 1732 to have scores sent to SAU. Credit will be applied to the SAU transcript after the Office of Registration and Records receives the official scores.

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The following CLEP exams will be given credit at Spring Arbor University when students receive scores equal to or above those shown below. Courses satisfied with CLEP exams will apply as lower-level only, even if the SAU equivalent course is upper-level.
